## HOLSWORTHY WALK AND TALK

A lovely autumn morning last month welcomed our Level 3 group to Duckpool, near Bude with the sun shining and an iridescent sea. We set out back up the access road and out over King William's Bridge which was built by Parson Hawker of Morwenstow in 1836. Parson Hawker was a colourful character and is well known for his writing of



poems and letters from 'Hawkers Hut'. He was also known for his compassion by giving Christian burials to shipwrecked seamen washed up on the shore of his parish. A steep climb then took us through some woodland and ancient tracks and out to Stowe Barton, an historic walled property currently owned by The National Trust. There is said to be archaeological evidence of a Tudor Mansion on the site, superseded by a house built by the Grenville family which was subsequently demolished in the 18<sup>th</sup> century following the death of the last Grenville. Our walk continued through fields and woodland coming out into the tranquil hamlet of Coombe complete with ford and convenient footbridge.

If you would like to join us on any of our walks to visit local places, meet new people and enjoy the benefits of walking our current programme of walks is available. Walks start at 10.30 and are **FREE.** Membership forms are available from our Volunteer Walk Leaders prior to the start of the walk.



# **EVELYN'S WALK**

On Monday 13th October, we met in the Parish Hall car park at Clawton. I was grateful to Maralyn Bailey for confirming that we wouldn't be causing any inconvenience as I know how well used the hall is for all sorts of community events. We repeated the route that we did in October last year as it's well liked and there's



always somebody who hasn't done it previously, even residents of the parish.

We turned left down the road and joined the footpath that's clearly marked on the right. The route was well marked taking us through a couple of lush grassy fields. We reminisced how the series of six galvanised self-closing gates used to be a series of challenging stiles until DCC improved the situation. We also reminisced about walking along the edge of fields planted with maize. That added a whole new dimension to a footpath walk.

When we reached Higher Sellick, the footpath took us through a gap in the hedge. If you blink, you will miss it and end up back on the road. We were greeted by a herd of inquisitive cows but they soon lost interest as they were actually more interested in following the leader of the herd into the adjacent field than us. We followed the footpath through a couple more lush green fields heading towards Hole Park. We did some more reminiscing about the beautiful hanging baskets that Joy Allin used to have every year. They were an absolute joy to behold.

When we reached the road, we turned right and then right again which brought us back to the Parish Hall. Along the way, we had an opportunity to talk to the landowner across whose fields we had been walking and say how much we had enjoyed our walk. It's a lovely circular route taking about 1.5 hours.
