Thankfully spring has made a tentative appearance following so much rain and attendant mud. The spring flowers are managing to emerge now which always gives us much needed colour and optimism.

This month, on the 13th May, we are celebrating 10 years of our Walk in the Park. Our first walk was on Monday 14th May 2014 for which one walker turned up! We now have an average of 14 walkers each week. The Walk in the Park came about as a result of an idea put forward by Penny Weighell, one of our Walk Leaders at the time, as she felt there was a need for a short walk for people with limited mobility who would benefit from the exercise and social opportunity. Penny was quite right, with many physical improvements being reported by the walkers and lots of laughter and friendships forged. If you, or anyone you know, has been involved with the Walk in the Park during the last ten years please feel free to come along to the Sports Pavilion in Stanhope Park on the 13th May at 10.30 am for a cuppa and reminisce.

Recently we resurrected a route which we haven't used since before the Covid pandemic. It was essentially a road walk, because our rural footpaths are still very muddy, and took us from The Square in Bradworthy, out towards Quoitgate Cross and then picking up the unclassified lane to Dinworthy. At Great Dinworthy Farm we returned to another surfaced lane and headed south to Crosspark and then back to The Square. A 3 mile round trip. There was very little traffic on the lanes and the panoramic views south from Dinworthy were magnificent in the sunny weather.

If you would like to join us we walk on Mondays and Fridays. All walks start at 10.30 am and are **FREE**. Membership forms are available from our Volunteer Walk Leaders prior to the start of the walk.

ROAD CLOSURE

AIRBAND SUPERFAST

A query from a resident regarding the lack of activity in delivering superfast installations prompted the Parish Clerk to ask them what is going on.

Airband replied: "Thank you for your query, which has been forwarded to us by the Customer Service Team. Since the last communication, activities in the Cluster area NF040 have not progressed at all and unfortunately, due to unforeseen developments, this build and others have been put on hold and remain so at the present time. This is whilst an internal build strategy review takes place. We have no timescales on the review as it is sitting with the Executive Team.

Due to this, we are sorry but we unable to provide any further information or a build update for the cluster. As soon as we are able, we will communicate via appropriate channels."

The response is extremely disappointing – Airband made a presentation in November 2021 to the effect that installation would be complete by Spring 2022. Here we are in Spring 2024 with no prospect of any wired broadband. We are looking at ways we can put pressure on a company which seems to have signed a contract which it is unable or unwilling to fulfil.

POTHOLE SUCCESS

Having been told no repairs would take place to the Leworthy road for at least a couple of years since being only a few dwellings they were not a priority, Leworthy resident Ron Morley has been campaigning to draw attention to the almost undriveable state of the road from Leworthy Manor to the hamlet's centre. He managed to get an item in the local press and our County Councillor, James Morrish, took the CEO and the Leader of Devon County Council to see for themselves what the road is like. Now Ron has received a letter saying the road would be closed for pothole repairs on 18, 19 and 22 April. Result! Congratulations to Ron.

The Parish Council are asking surrounding parishes if they would be interested in joining the Road Warden scheme which trains people to be able to fill potholes legally and safely, and provides the necessary equipment. If this goes ahead we will be asking for volunteers from areas with potholes to help us carry out the work, though some areas are so bad it might not be practical. Ideally, we would use this scheme to fill new developing potholes in roads which have been treated by the County Council rather than attempt to fill the huge existing holes.

Clearly pressure helps, as Ron has shown, so if your road is in a poor state why not get support from neighbours to write to local newspapers, Highways, the CEO and the Leader, copying in your Councillor James Morrish. I suggest writing because in my experience emails tend to be easy to ignore.
