# THE HEDGE FAIRY

The Hedge Fairy is definitely feeling rather chilly, so I have decided to share one of my winter warmer recipes with you:-

## Pretend Vegetable Pilaff — enough Comfort Food for 2-4 people

### Base Vegetable Ingredients

1 x red pepper (sliced)  
1 x green pepper (sliced)  
1 x yellow /orange pepper (sliced)  
1 large or 2 small red onions (sliced)  
1 large or 2 small normal onions (sliced)  
3 cloves of garlic (sliced/ squashed/sliced) or large spoon of garlic paste  
All the above to be mixed together and fried gently in a frying pan or roasted in an oven.

### Rice

1 x cup long grain rice  
2 x cups water  
1 stock cube ( whatever flavour takes your fancy) or 1/2 teaspoon Marmite/Bovril  
Put all this in a saucepan, bring to the boil, cover with a lid and turn the heat off and forget about it for at least 10 minutes.

### Finishing ingredients

Approximately 2 ounces of cheese (cheddar/ fresh parmesan grated) optional  
A large squirt of tomato paste

If you want a wider variety of veg, then peas and sweetcorn can be cooked off separately.

Put the cooked rice in a large bowl and fluff up. Add the roasted vegetables, any other vegetables, tomato paste and cheese and mix it all together. Cosy up and eat - any leftovers can be frozen.

Above is a photograph, believed to be taken around 1970, of their public address van which was used throughout the South West.

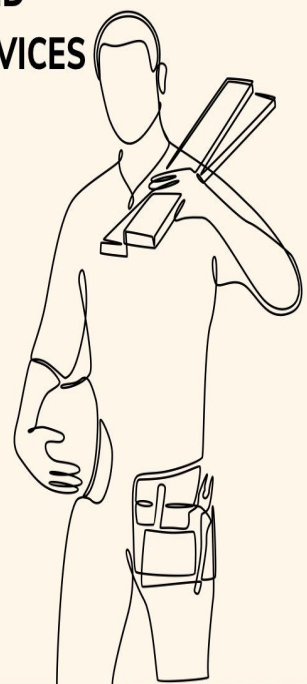

## Clawton Community History Project as school celebrates 150 years.

Clawton Primary School is preparing to celebrate a remarkable milestone as it approaches its 150th anniversary in 2026. To mark this special occasion, among other festivities the school's PTA and teaching staff are working together to create a commemorative book charting the history of Clawton Primary School and local communities like Clawton and Tetcott from 1876 through to the present day. The book will capture the memories, stories and images that reflect the community and school's rich heritage and the many lives it has touched over the years.

Former pupils, past and present members of staff and the wider community are warmly invited to contribute. The team is seeking photographs of memorable moments, as well as written recollections and anecdotes that can be included in the publication. Whether it is a fond memory of school days, a photograph of a school play or sports event, or a story that highlights village life, all contributions will help bring the school's history in the community to life. The committee is also keen to get in touch with history enthusiasts who would like to contribute by researching and writing about the history of rural education in England and village life. It will be a credit to the book if local stories and events can be related to these changes in society events in history, as you will understand that 150 years starts in the Victorian age where 'Empire Day' was still celebrated and the roads were often made of dirt, and schooling was not common and scarlet fever or whooping cough outbreaks were regular events. Some decades later the school log books make note of donations to the soldiers at the front in WW1, followed by the welcoming of evacuee children at the school in WW2 to the present day with all its technological advancements.

An open invitation has been extended for people to bring along any materials on **Monday 9<sup>th</sup> February** when all are welcome to visit the school **from 3:45-5pm**. They can then learn more about the project in a relaxed setting with tea and coffee provided. This will be an opportunity to meet those involved, share stories, and find out how contributions will be used in the anniversary book.

# Public consultation - submit your response!



### Stand up for the future of your home heating – respond by 10<sup>th</sup> February

The government is currently consulting on how homes like yours will be heated in the future, and this is your chance to make sure your voice is heard. The government's view is that low temperature heat pumps will be the primary low carbon technology for decarbonising most homes, but it recognises they may not be suitable for everyone. This is particularly true for homes off the gas grid that rely on oil heating.

The consultation seeks views on a range of alternative options. The problem with the majority of these is that it involves replacing your existing heating system, and in most cases, this is extremely costly. The data in the consultation also suggests these alternative options are no cheaper to use than existing oil heating systems.

However, the consultation also says that liquid biofuels may play a role. The big advantage of this approach is that homeowners using oil already do not need to change their heating system – the renewable liquid fuel can be used in any existing or new oil heating system. The industry is ready to begin introducing this option but needs the support of government to make this happen.

It's crucial that households have access to a range of viable choices, including renewable liquid heating fuels. Sharing your views through the consultation is the most important way to ensure this happens and, to make it easy, the Future Ready Fuel campaign has created an automated platform to enable you to submit a pre-prepared response – it only takes a minute.
