### Clawton Parish Council News - from Paul Grafton

#### **Woodland Encampment**

You may well have noticed that someone has purchased an area of woodland to the west of the A388 about a quarter of a mile south of the Holsworthy Forest. A gap in the roadside bank has been made into an entrance and deliveries of building materials have been seen. A fence and gate have been erected which means what is being done can no longer be seen from the road.

The Planning Officer from Torridge District Council has visited the site and informed the owner that planning permission is needed. No application has been submitted to date.

The Parish Council is very concerned to have received several reports of near collisions with vehicles using the entrance. It is understood that Devon Highways have taken the view that since there has always been a gap in the bank it is not a new entrance, and (presumably on the usual grounds that no-one has yet been killed or injured) may not object to use of the entrance if retrospective planning permission were granted.

This is especially puzzling as there seems to be an alternative entrance available which would not give rise to the same hazards.

Please could you let the Parish Council know of any 'close encounters' at that entrance and of any other relevant information you may have. If retrospective planning permission is sought it would be helpful to know your views regarding whether the Parish Council should oppose it.

## AIRBAND FIBRE BROADBAND IS NEARLY HERE!

As we announced some time ago, Airband won the Government contract (through the Connecting Devon & Somerset project) for providing FTTP (Fibre To The Premises) connectivity for large areas of Devon and Somerset. The roll-out has now reached the Clawton area. Airband engineers have carried out a survey to determine the infrastructure of which (mainly BT's) poles and ducts can be used as part of this fibre roll out and to reach those "In Contract" premises listed under this contract. Many other premises along the fibre route or close by will also be able to get connected (subject to survey). New additional poles may need to be erected where those existing cannot be used. Airband are now asking people to register interest to determine whether they are on or near the fibre route. The proposed build complete date is Spring 2022.

They will be laying fibre-optic cable, using the current infrastructure where possible and usually alongside existing BT copper telephone wiring. Homes and businesses to be connected will usually have a hole drilled through the outside wall with a fibre-optic terminal installed inside. This will be linked to an Airband router. If your house is listed you will need to provide a Listed Building Consent Form.



#### What does FTTP stand for?

FTTP stands for Fibre To The Premises (as opposed to FTTC – Fibre To The Cabinet – which used existing copper telephone cabling from the cabinet (where the fibre-optic cable terminates) to each house. There's no line rental or phone line required, and you could end your landline contract if you wish. If you still need a landline telephone you can arrange a VOIP (Voice Over Internet Protocol) service with a specialist provider such as Vonage which will provide a landline telephone service over the Airband system.

The map below shows the planned route of the network.



#### **In Contract Premises**

These are those premises which Airband undertook to connect under the contract. If you live next to or near any of these you're likely to be able to be connected.

## Prices and packages

These will be confirmed once the network is working and ready to connect users, but as a guideline, sample residential packages would be £99 to be connected (Subject to survey – Includes Twistport unit and Router) and £30 per month for a 100mbps line (100mbps download, 25mbps upload) and £37 per month for a 250mbps line (250mbps download and 50mbps upload), both on an 18-month contract. Connection fees are subject to survey – Extra connections costs (ECC's) may incur if additional work is needed to get the property connected or where they are unable to use the current infrastructure.

Residential lines come with an SLA (Service Level Agreement) of 5 days, being the time within which they contractually commit to fix a fault. Enhanced SLAs are available at extra cost, and Business packages are also available

## How to get connected (Fibre)

- Check your postcode at <a href="www.airband.co.uk">www.airband.co.uk</a> and use the drop-down address bar Those "In Contract" are able to register through this process
- Those premises "Not in Contract" register your interest using the 'Contact Us General Enquiry' stating you interest to connect to the fibre network. Alternatively, email <a href="mailto:paul.nethercott@airband.co.uk">paul.nethercott@airband.co.uk</a> (Airband Community Liaison Executive). Note that the range of packages available to Clawton residents is not yet on the website.
- You will then get regular updates on progress regarding the fibre roll out for this area.
- You'll get a free survey to check there are no issues then an Airband engineer and where possible, using the current infrastructure, will connect you up to the fibre network.
- If you are already contracted to another supplier Airband may be prepared to buy you out of the contract.
- If you are not close to the red line on the map but are part of a hamlet with a number of separate premises it's worth checking with Airband if they can connect you. There are other options available (BDUK Government Voucher Scheme Wireless -4G)

### If Airband can't connect me or it's too expensive

# Monthly Walks from Evelyn Sharman

On Monday 8th November, I led a walk from Tetcott Village Hall. This was never included on the programme of Inter Parish walks so I was very keen to introduce the route to anyone who wanted to join me. There were eleven of us in all which included four people that I hadn't walked with since before the start of the COVID pandemic. It was especially nice to see them after such a long time.

We set off along the lane towards Luffincott. The sign said it was a 12% hill & it had been a conscious decision to walk down it as Gill & I had walked this route in the opposite direction previously. I had tried to kid her into believing that I had stopped to admire the view when in fact I had needed to catch my breath!! One of our group pointed out that a new road bridge had been built in 1931 to replace the original track which was still very evident amongst the trees on the left. We took a turning on the right which took us to Luffincott Barton. Along the way, one of our group pointed out where the Rectory had once stood until it burnt to the ground in 1911. Next to Luffincott Barton is St. James' Church. It



is a Grade I listed building & is maintained by The Churches Conservation Trust. It is well worth a visit in order to admire its simplicity but also a beautiful barrel vaulted roof, a 14th century font & beautiful stained glass windows. There is much to admire externally too. From here we followed the footpath which took us across the Tetcott Estate. We enjoyed a most glorious mixture of tranquil park land, woodland sporting autumnal colours & following the course of a stream. We even discovered a derelict cottage that used to be inhabited by a music teacher. It would appear that it had a telephone line but I believe water would have come from a well & electricity from a generator. The footpath brought us to Tetcott Manor which we all admired. We enjoyed the walk past the Church, something to be visited another day, & across the park land to rejoin the road. It was only a short stroll back to our cars making a walk of approx. four miles. It took us two & a half hours but it definitely wasn't a walk to be hurried with so much of interest to take on board along the way.

The next walk will be on Monday 13th December. We will set off at 10am from Higher Larkworthy Farm with very kind permission from the Kirk family. I would be grateful if you could let me know in advance if you would like to join me so that I can tell you in advance about the route. Parking is also limited.
