their splendour. We noted that this section of the Bude Canal had also been cleared of vegetation. We remarked the previous month that works had been carried out along the Lower Tamar section. The tow paths along the entire route are beautifully kept making walking very pleasant in peace and tranquillity.

Our Level 3 walk from Bradworthy Square took us through Berridon Farm. This section of the footpath has recently been re-routed with a 'Permissive Path' to avoid the farmyard. The new path is very well signed, maintained and took us into a field where we found some very friendly donkeys who seemed to find us as interesting and we found them.

In February we ran a Walk Leader Training course. Thank you to all who attended and congratulations to John Weighell and Richard Cook who have now progressed to be Walk Leaders. Three other walkers are in the process of completing the process. Walk Leaders and Back Markers are an essential part of the Walking Group and we thank all those who are willing to give up their time and effort to support our ever increasing numbers.

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The following is a brief summary of the recent meeting of the Council.

- War Memorial: Inspection shows it requires a clean and some repointing. The lettering may need to be repainted over as it has been in the past. Iain Nunn and Graham Hames kindly offered to do the work rather than have the Council pay for it to be done.
- **Crime Report:** The Council no longer gets visits from our local police community officer and no longer receives local crime reports. The Clerk found the only crime report data available is online and covers the 136 postcodes in the Torridge District.
- **Planning Permission granted:** Rural workers' dwelling (self-build) adjacent Little Blagdon (Torridge Planning ref 1/1007/2024/FUL).
- **VAS Speed Signs:** The attempt to get one or (ideally) 2 illuminated speed signs (like St. Giles) is being doggedly pursued by Graham Hames but the bureaucracy he is meeting is mind-numbing.
- **'Meet the Councillors' social event:** This will be held on 19th May, where everyone will be welcome but especially those who have moved into the Parish over the last two or three years. It will start at 7pm, before the 8pm Annual General Meeting so that attendees can if they wish stay for the short meeting where Chair and Vice Chair are elected and the various village activity groups report on the past year. A normal Parish Council Meeting will follow at 8:30pm.
- Grant for Churchyard: A grant of £1500 was approved to contribute towards the upkeep of St Leonard's churchyard. The graveyard is a village facility open for interment of residents of any religion or none.
- Grass cutting: A new contractor has begun grass cutting in the village.
- Building site to the rear of Riverside Cottage: Cllr Nunn provided a brief update on the housing development. The administration of transferring ownership of an area of land to the Parish Council to make a bigger car park is ongoing. There is no firm date for the commencement of building work.
- **VE Day Event:** A grant of £300 towards the cost of this event was agreed.
- Potholes: The deterioration of some village roads such as the bottom of Horslett Hill was discussed several ideas about how to put pressure on Devon Highways to prioritise our roads were debated including the possibility of finding an angle which might lead to a story on BBC Spotlight.
